#### IN MEMORIAM-

Walter Self (Bucky) Barnes '64 - Age 73, of Louisville, TN, passed away Wednesday, April 27, 2011. Walter was born in Knoxville, TN on December 20, 1937. He developed his interest in airplanes and flying from his grandfather, Walter I, Self, owner of the first airport in Knoxville, and took flying lessons as a teenager at Island Home Airport. As a boy, he won the Knoxville Journal Carriers' contest to meet Gen. Douglass MacArthur. He graduated from Young High in 1955 and from UT in 1964 as an Industrial Engineer. Walter served in the US Army at Ft. Bliss, TX. He worked for GE and retired from Owens Corning Fiberglass. He was awarded AllE's 1976 Engineer of the Year. He is survived by his loving wife of 47 years Minga Bohlmann Barnes, three sons and other family.

**Robert Lee Kouns, Jr.** – Age 88, passed away Saturday, October 9, 2010, surrounded by

his loving wife and family. Mr. Kouns was born February 28, 1922 in Memphis, TN. He graduated from Catholic High School in Memphis and attended Memphis State University. Mr. Kouns voluntarily left Memphis State University to serve his country during World War II as a Naval Aviator in the Pacific Theater. For his service in the Pacific Theater, Mr. Kouns was awarded three Air Medals and a Presidential Unit Commendation Ribbon. Mr. Kouns retired from the US Navy with the rank of Lieutenant Commander. After leaving military service, Mr. Kouns maintained his multi-engine Commercial Pilots License. He was an honorary initiate to Tennessee Alpha. Mr. Kouns is survived by his high school and college sweetheart and beloved wife of 63 years Barbara Gurley Kouns; daughter Diana Kuhlman; son Vincent and John; five grandchildren and twelve greatgrandchildren.

Alumni scholarships are one way alumni support can directly impact and help the undergraduate chapter. Scholarship grants are vivid proof of alumni support and provide the chapter a valuable recruiting tool. In addition, the scholarships encourage the undergraduate brothers to:

- Participate in chapter activities
- Achieve higher academic standards
- Develop leadership skills
- Live in the chapter house
- Engage in campus activities

Brothers needing financial assistance are also considered as a separate factor. The awards may help to ensure that dedicated young brothers can continue working toward the completion of their University of Tennessee diploma.

During the 2012 Parent's Day Brunch, Chapter Counselor Kelly Williams presented a proud display of forty young brothers as recipients of a 2011-2012 alumni scholarship.

The Selection Committee does not have an easy task. The number of deserving applicants continues to exceed the resources available for scholarship grants.

However, Tennessee Alpha's alumni scholarship program has come a long way. The establishment of alumni scholarships was first presented at the 1980 Founder's Day Dinner with the granting of one \$200 scholarship which provided one quarter's tuition. Last year (2011-2012) grants were awarded to thirty-three Sig Eps, including one \$5,000 and two \$4,000 grants.

Tennessee Alpha scholarships recognize and honor the contributions of several alumni brothers.

The Burl Rainwater Scholarship honors Tennessee Alpha's most dedicated alumnus. For more than 30 years, Brother Rainwater worked tirelessly to make Tennessee Alpha the best Sig Ep alumni association in the country. His hard work and dedication to Sigma Phi Epsilon is a shining example of diligence and the lifetime experience of brotherhood.

The John Pennington Scholarship honors the memory of the brother who is generally

credited with the motivational force behind the program.

The James O. King Scholarship honors the extensive support and long term participation of a past chapter Comptroller (V.P. of Finance) and campus leader.

The Dick Panther Scholarship was the first named Tennessee Alpha alumni scholarship. It honors the long-term contribution and patient support of the chapter's past District Governor.

The Haynes Barnes Scholarship memorializes one of the chapter's most dedicated alums, who served as Housing Corporation spokesman for almost forty years.

The Col. Fred Wade Scholarship honors the memory of an early member who provided leadership and financial support during many critical periods over nine decades.

The Marty Wilkerson Scholarship honors the memory of a brother whose brotherly commitment and influence are felt even today.

The Tom Frazier Scholarship honors the memory of a brother dedicated to rush and overall excellence.

The Bill Livesay Scholarship honors a brother's memory and the extensive intramural contributions he made with a scholarship to the outstanding intramural participant.

The E. Herbert Qualls Award honors the memory of a past chapter president and grand chapter officer who made exceptional contributions over many years. His award recognizes the pledge demonstrating the greatest commitment to the Fraternity during the pledgeship period through balanced participation, and the scholarships recognize recently initiated brothers.



# THE HISTORY OF TENNESSEE ALPHA

#### THE FOUNDING AND HISTORY OF PHI ALPHA PHI

In the fall of 1910, a small group of men at the University of Tennessee decided the six existing national fraternities on campus didn't offer the seriousness of mind and spirit, nor the dedication towards excellence they desired. With the encouragement of Tennessee football and basketball coach Andrew A. Stone, they formed a local fraternity, Phi Alpha Phi, and were given official status by the University. Brother James W. Love was the founder of the fraternity and was elected as its first archon (president).

They immediately petitioned Phi Delta Theta for a charter since one of their university advisors was a member of that fraternity. As time passed, they increased their numbers and solidified their organization with a constitution and by-laws. They secured and furnished a chapter room in Humes Hall above the Pi Kappa Alpha chapter room.

In early November of 1911, they sent a committee of four men to the district convention of Phi Delta Theta in Nashville. The committee was received with friendly courtesy and given considerate attention while presenting their petition, but they returned home with no decision.

Phi Alpha Phi continued to prosper. In the spring of 1912, they secured a chapter house at 921 Temple Avenue (now the Claxton Education building on Volunteer Boulevard). Their membership numbered in the 30's which was quite large in those days.

Once again, in early November of 1912, a committee from Phi Alpha Phi attended another district convention of Phi Delta Theta in Atlanta and petitioned for a charter, but again returned home with no commitment.

#### ENTER SIGMA PHI EPSILON

One member, James R. Meaders, had grown weary of waiting for action on their petition to Phi Delta Theta. He had heard excellent reports of Sigma Phi Epsilon. The founding principles of Sigma Phi Epsilon were closely attuned to the seriousness of mind and spirit of Phi Alpha Phi. Further evidence attesting to the quality of Sigma Phi Epsilon was its record of rapid expansion in such a short time.

In March of 1913, Brother Meaders contacted the national office of Sigma Phi Epsilon and Grand Secretary William L. Phillips immediately made a visit to Knoxville. Brother Phillips was entertained at dinner and was given a tour of Knoxville and the campus by a committee of James Meaders, Earl Copeland, and Joe Thomason. He then visited the chapter house and met all the members of Phi Alpha Phi.

Just one look was all it took for "Uncle Billy" Phillips to realize there was something special about Phi Alpha Phi. There was much debate in weighing the pros and cons, but in due time, a vote was called. Phi Alpha Phi voted to petition Sigma Phi Epsilon with only five dissenting votes. The petition was promptly accepted and a chartering date was set.

As fate would have it, just three weeks after being accepted into Sigma Phi Epsilon, official notice of approval was received by Phi Delta Theta. However, it was too late...Phi Alpha Phi would become the Tennessee Alpha Chapter of Sigma Phi Epsilon.



# HISTORY OF TENNESSEE ALPHA

#### THE CHARTERING OF TENNESSEE ALPHA

On May 28, 1913, "Uncle Billy" Phillips arrived in Knoxville and was warmly received by the brotherhood. He was joined by Brothers Herbert Carr and Willis Milner from the Georgia Alpha Chapter at Georgia Tech to assist with the ritual ceremony.

The next day, on Thursday, May 29, 1913 Tennessee Alpha was chartered as the 45th chapter of Sigma Phi Epsilon. Brother Meaders was initiated first, and then assisted Brothers Phillips, Carr, and Milner with the initiation of the other members of Phi Alpha Phi into Sigma Phi Epsilon.



Following dinner, James W. Love, who was not available earlier, was initiated into Sigma Phi Epsilon as the 17th initiate of the chapter. The founders of Tennessee Alpha went to bed in the early hours of the morning with the feeling that a great future lay ahead.

Brother Meaders's efforts had been timely, Sigma Phi Epsilon reacted promptly, and a new national fraternity was chartered at The University of Tennessee.
