IN MEMORIAM

Joseph Dray Crouch (pledged fall 2010) – of Ooltewah, died on Tuesday, February 26, 2013 at his home. He was born in Memphis, TN, and graduated from McCallie in 2010. Dray was a Life Guard at First Cumberland Presbyterian Church for four years. He will be greatly missed by his peers in the chapter.

Jeffery W. Jones '80 – of Franklin, TN, died August 19, 2012 after an extended illness from cancer. He was born November 24, 1958 in Memphis, TN. He attended the Department of Defense Central High School in London, England, the University of Tennessee in Knoxville and the University of Memphis. He served as an air traffic controller in the U.S. Air

Force and worked 10 years for Scientific Atlanta, installing earth satellite antennas around the world. For the past several years, he owned Prime Focus Construction, a home remodeling and construction business. He was an avid golfer and sports enthusiast.

James Robert "Bob" Kendall – died on Wednesday, March 6, 2013, at his residence after a long battle with Parkinson's Disease. A Renaissance of Brotherhood initiate of Tennessee Alpha, Bob attended Central High and University of Chattanooga. He was employed by Procter & Gamble for 27 years and enjoyed time with his family, friends and dogs. He was a president of the Big Orange Club and an avid Tennessee Volunteers fan.

After Tennessee Alpha's first initiate, Jimmy Meaders, was inducted, he assisted with

the initiation of the other 16 members which became the founding fathers of the Tennessee Alpha Chapter. During the program on Saturday night, Chapter president, Wes Quarles presented a nice framed certificate to Andrew Byrd of the Georgia Alpha chapter to be hung in the Georgia Tech chapter house. "This certificate is our way of recognizing and saying thank you to our sister chapter for assisting with our installation in 1913," said Brother Quarles.

On Friday afternoon, over 80 alumni got to experience the Ritual one more time as the chapter honorarily initiated Col. (Ret) Richard Burris during the Renaissance of Brotherhood Celebration. Following the ceremony, the chapter hosted a reception in Richard's honor.

While the brothers celebrated the Ritual, the ladies were treated to a tour of the new Sorority Village by Virginia Rainwater. After the tour, they joined the brothers at the chapter house for the reception.

Everyone was free to enjoy dinner and era specific activities on their own on Friday evening. The 1950's alumni gathered at the Marriott for dinner that evening, while the "Melrose Crowd" enjoyed dinner at Ye Olde Steak House. 1980's and 1990's alumni were treated to a reunion



concert of The Hodags (a band comprised of SigEps) at the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. The 2000's alumni gathered in the "Old City" at 90 Proof. The open schedule on Friday evening gave plenty of time for renewing friendships.

Saturday morning began with the Alumni Brunch held at Calhoun's on the River. Over 170 Sig Eps and guests were treated to a delicious brunch buffet and a view of the Tennessee River. However, brotherhood was

The ballroom was decorated with purple, red, and gold balloons which set the tone for a wonderful celebration (more about the dinner on page 14). 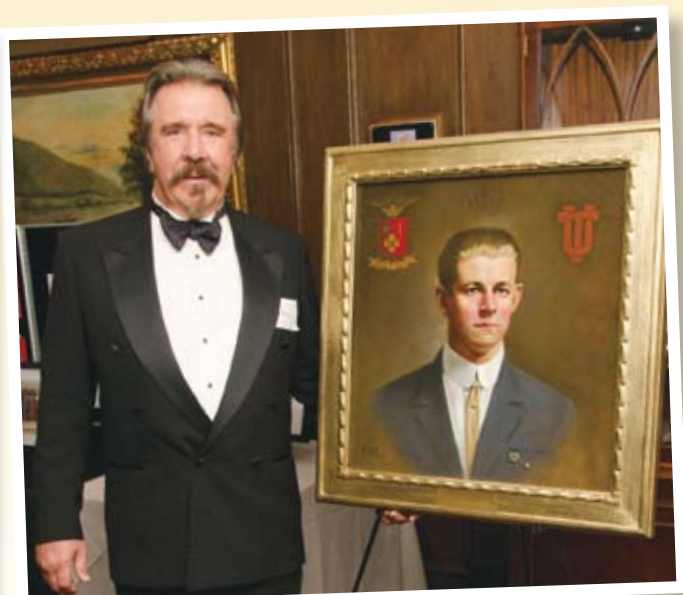

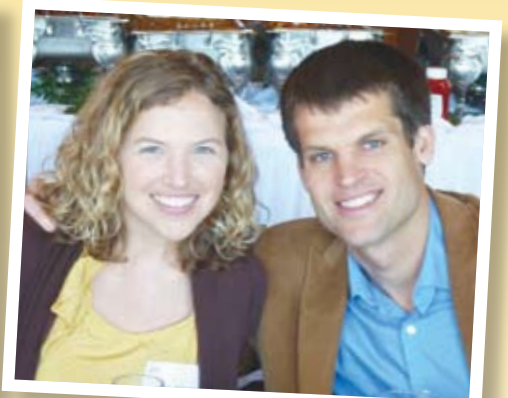
