IN MEMORIAM

RICHARD MORGAN WILLIAMS, JR. '53

— Passed away peacefully at his home on October 14, 2012 at the age of 85. He was born on August 22, 1927 in Bardwell, KY to Richard M. Williams, Sr. and Allie Lucile Housman Williams. After graduating from Owensboro HS in Owensboro, KY, he served post WWII in Japan for the Army Medical Corps and one of his biggest thrills was climbing Mt. Fuji while there. Then, as a statistics major, he graduated from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville in 1953. He married his wife of 60 years, Betty

Hamilton Williams, on December 20, 1952. He and Betty moved to Memphis shortly after their marriage, where he worked for Firestone Tire and Rubber Company, and the National Cotton Council where he compiled and published a statistical publication on the uses of cotton called "Cotton Council's Customers". In 1969, he joined his two brothers at National Butane Gas Co., where he eventually became General Manager until his retirement in 1993. Mostly, though, he was defined by his three loves, Jesus Christ, his wife and family,

and the Big Orange. On football Saturdays you could always find him pacing a hole in the carpet, while either listening to UT football games on the radio, or watching on TV. That love of UT football began as an equipment manager his freshman year while General Neyland was the coach. He was a faithful member of Eudora Baptist Church for 52 years, where he served as deacon for many years. After his retirement, he enjoyed traveling to places like Alaska and England, but if the weather was nice, he also enjoyed playing golf with his friends.

TN ALPHA ANNOUNCES NEW YOUNG ALUMNI PROGRAM FOR HALL OF FAME

For many years, the Hall of Fame has been Tennessee Alpha's way of recognizing brothers who have given outstanding support to Sigma Phi Epsilon. When first established, the financial contribution level for selection into the Hall of Fame was \$2,500. This was a large amount at the time, and for many years this amount never changed, although many people began increasing their financial support well beyond this level. In May of 1999, the Alumni Association announced a new level of \$10,000 for the Hall of Fame.

While the \$10,000 level better reflected those who have gone above and beyond, many felt we should have a special program to attract young alumni into the Hall of Fame. We are pleased to announce a new Young Alumni Program.

Under the new program, any brother who has contributed a total of \$5,000 to Tennessee Alpha by age 40 will be eligible for selection into the Hall of Fame. One current Hall of Fame brother was quoted as saying, "What a great way for past scholarship recipients to give back to the fraternity to help future SigEps."

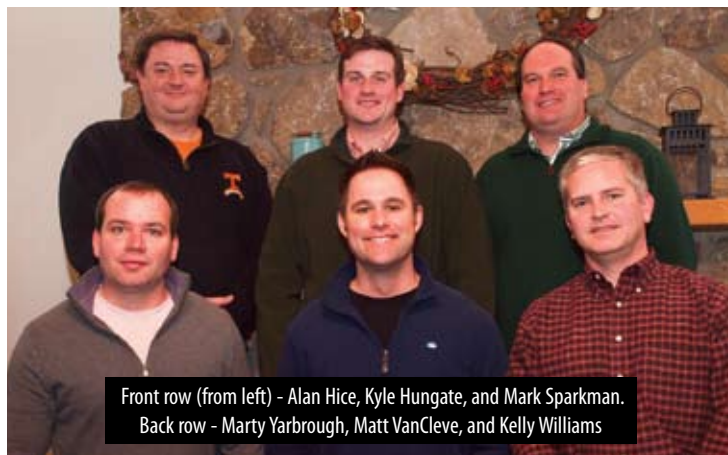

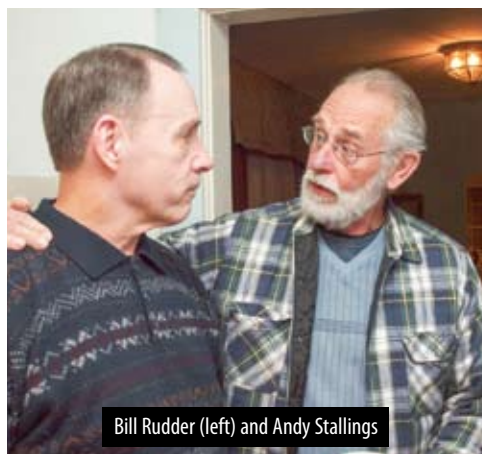

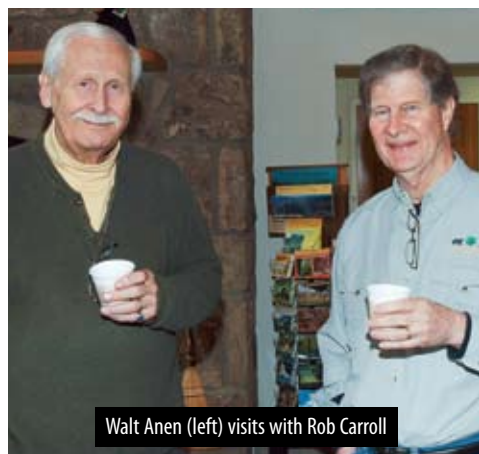
